UIRs are completed for incidents occurring in, or with children enrolled in, a <u>licensed facility</u> .		•	 The day the incident occurs: Call or email a Child Development Manager Call or email your Area Manager. Fill out an Unusual Incident Report. Scan a copy of the Unusual Incident Report and CFS report (if one has been made) to the Unusual Incident folder. Do not move to the next step until management contact has been made. 		2) 	 Once a Child Development Manager has approved the UIR: Call Community Care Licensing at 895-5033 and report the incident/accident within 1 business day. Fax or mail a copy of the UIR to CCL within 7 days of incident. Directors will notify the Region IX and State Program Specialists of any incidents that results in serious injury or harm to a child, violates Head Start standards of conduct at 45 CFR 1302.90(c) or results in a child being left alone, unsupervised, or released to an unauthorized adult, as soon as possible, but no later than seven calendar days.
